New Harbour – Isolated Danger Mark Buoy


An Isolated Danger Mark spar buoy has been laid in the New Harbour to mark the sunken wrecks of the 'Fair Isle' and 'Ferocious' in approximate position 53^o 19'.4 N, 004^o 38'.5W

These wrecks pose a continuing danger to navigation and should be given a wide berth. It is reported that parts of the superstructure and masts are exposed at low water springs.

The previously unlit wreck buoys have been removed and the new mark is fitted with a white light flashing twice every 10 seconds (Fl(2)10s) with a nominal range of 2 miles. The buoy also carries a top mark of two black spheres.
