

HOLYHEAD – LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS 05/2024

Visiting Cruise Vessels

Issued 1st January 2024 Expires 31st December 2024

Mariners and harbour users are advised that cruise ships will be visiting the port from April until October 2024 on a frequent basis. A full list of calls is maintained on the Port Authority's website and can be found using the home page link, or at https://holyheadport.co.uk/pages/cruise.

It is currently anticipated that the majority of vessels will berth alongside the Deep Water Jetty but some will be anchoring and conducting tendering operations to take passengers ashore. Those scheduled to anchor are listed below, but this is subject to change:

Vessels are expected to anchor approximately 3 cables East-by-South of the Breakwater Light House.

Arrival and departure times of the vessels will be promulgated by Port Control but tender operations may be conducted at any time during a ships' call.

Attention: Masters of visiting cruise vessels; their advising Pilots; the Masters of ferries; and other vessels using the Traffic Separation Scheme; your attention is drawn to Rule10(g) and the need for cooperation as for practical reasons the cruise vessels will have to anchor near the termination, or potentially encroach in to, the TSS.

Harbour users, including paddle boarders, canoeists, and jet-skiers, are request not to approach cruise vessels too closely so as not to create safety and security alerts.
